"Encore brides generally go the step above," comments Christine Langevin of Charter Oak Country Club, (978) 562-0800. "The reception now becomes not so traditional and it is a representation of themselves. For example, no formal cake cutting or special dances. Your dinner can be a plated dinner or stations, with a band or DJ to dance the night away."

FREEDOM

"When planning an encore wedding," notes Tanya Matthews, Senior Sales Manager of the Holiday Inn Brookline, (617) 277-1200, "the bride tends to have a lot more flexibility than first-time brides. The encore bride has the freedom to incorporate colors in dress, change traditions and add a more personalized touch to her reception and wedding. The encore bride is usually older and therefore has already learned to celebrate who she is so when it comes time to personalize her wedding, it will be a piece of cake!"

"Most encore brides want *simple elegance*," asserts Mary. "Family participation is very important to them.
