Ashley's colors were lavender and green, so the main flower in her bouquet was the Cool Water lavender rose. The boutonnieres were created by Nunan's in Georgetown.

Ashley and Brian were married at the Boston Massachusetts Temple in Belmont. It's known for being the 100th operating temple of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.
